




Land Acknowledgement:

FDK reduces risks in language and cognitive development (JK)

Non FDK 15.8% risk ^{1 Year FDK} 15.7% risk

2 Years FDK 4.3% risk



Note: Children in the 2 year FDK group had already benefitted from FDK in their Junior Kindergarten year at the time of measurement. 1 year FDK group had not yet benefitted from FDK as the program began in SK for these students. FDK reduces risks in social competence (SK)

NOTE: LABEL EVERYTHING!!! Put in a Ziploc bag please. Clothing should be comfortable and allow for your child to independently dress themselves. Practice putting on velcro shoes and jackets **independently**!

Lunch:

- We have **two** nutritional breaks. Each one is twenty minutes long.
- A variety of healthy food choices in small quantities are encouraged.
- <u>Practice</u> opening containers this summer and picking which foods to eat first.
- Please check labels to ensure all food is **nut free**.
- Some classrooms may require additional requirements for the safety of all and that will be communicated by the educators during the first days of school.







School Cash Online:

- We are a paperless school! We use school cash online!
- Sign up to pay for hot lunch, field trips etc.

Student Absence:

• If your child is going to be away, you MUST call the safe arrival phone number to let us know.

- It is a 24 hour answering machine with instructions for safe arrival
- Safe Arrival registration forms will go home in September.



Volunteering:

- All parents who wish to be CONSIDERED for volunteering **MUST** have a current criminal reference check (vulnerable section).
- Go online to register for VOLUNTEERING at <u>www.scdsb.on.ca</u> and use the 'community apps' link.
- If a criminal records check is needed, you will need a school form signed by administration to upload with the OPP; this can be picked up in the front office.
- This must be completed in September 2023.



Medical:

□ If your child has a medical condition that we need to be aware of, a Plan of Care needs to be completed by you.

<u>Anaphylaxis</u> <u>Diabetes</u> <u>Epilepsy</u> <u>Asthma</u> <u>General(Other)</u>

- □ If your child will need medication administered or stored at school, a Plan of Care (see specific links above) and a <u>Medical Form</u> (signed by a doctor) must be completed.
- □ To obtain these forms please contact the office or click the links above.
- □ These forms must be in place for the first day of school or ASAP.

Bussing Information:


- Home to School Bus information was given to eligible families during the registration process.

- Each classroom is unique, yet follows the practices & expectations of the Kindergarten Program.
- In Kindergarten, students are outside EVERYDAY. Always dress appropriately for the outside weather.

Fast Facts:

- We practice self-regulation everyday and encourage your child to be independent with their lunch, shoes, jackets and belongings (it is good to practice these skills leading up to kindergarten).
- Kindergarten students do not need pencil cases. Only their indoor shoes and extra clothes required.
- Donations such as tissues, antibacterial foaming hand soap and paper towel are always appreciated.



Parents Guide to Literacy & Math in Kindergarten:

(A Parent's Guide to Literacy and Mathematics)



A PARENT'S GUIDE TO LITERACY AND MATHEMATICS IN FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN

Full-day kindergarten (kindergarten) is designed to give your child a stronger start in school and in life – by providing an engaging learning program during the school day that is based on a child's natural desire for play. All children enter school capable, competent and ready to learn. Kindergarten will help them grow physically, socially, emotionally and intellectually.

The kindergarten program is organized into four broad areas or "frames." They reflect the way in which learning naturally occurs during children's exploration, play and inquiry.

- » Belonging and Contributing
- » Self-Regulation and Well-Being
- » Demonstrating Literacy and Mathematics Behaviours
- » Problem Solving and Innovating

About literacy and math

Before starting school, children have already had a wide range of experiences with words, letters, numbers and pictures, and have used language and mathematical thinking at home and in their community.

Learning happens when people are actively engaged in thinking and working together. This is the foundation of the kindergatten program. Children learn different ways to think about things, to consider different perspectives and to think critically about information. This is more than only identifying letters and numbers. Children may show their understanding by:

- writing, painting or drawing
- exploring things and asking questions or making comments about what they observe
- drawing pictures and/or printing some numbers, letters, and/or words
- creating with materials such as blocks, sand or recycled items

What happens at school?

The Child

Each child is a unique individual. Learning success depends on the development of feelings of confidence and self-esteem as well as the recognition of the value of the child's individual abilities.

The Educators

The teachers and early childhood educators create rich learning environments that are safe, caring, accepting, challenging and stimulating. Children are expected to think, to notice, to question, to explore, to discover, and to make connections. The educators carefully observe each child in order to know his or her growing capabilities and then provide appropriate learning experiences.



Play

Play is the child's natural way of making sense of the world. Children learn when all their senses are actively involved. They need to talk and think about everything they do. This is why our Kindergartens are active environments where children are involved with ideas, feelings, and concepts. Research indicates that play is the way young children learn best.
